Renovated Cobo Center gearing up for Detroit's 2012 North American International Auto Show

Visitors to the 2012 North American International Auto Show in Detroit next month will get a glimpse of the best vehicles in the industry, as well as their first look at the newly renovated Cobo Center.

The well-known **Detroit** venue -particularly made popular by Kiss -is in the final stage of a more than \$300 million renovation, which includes a 25,000-square-foot expansion and other renovations that are expected to be ready for the January auto show.

"We're pleased with the progress," said Thom Connors, Cobo Center general

manager, as he guided a group of journalists through the venue Tuesday afternoon. "There's every indication that this year's show is bigger and better; and the displays, and what you are seeing here, are among the finest that are put together anywhere in the world for an industrial trade show."

Other improvements expected to be ready for this year's show include 400 additional parking spaces; enclosed loading docks, which help keep the inside warmer; a walkway to Joe Louise Arena, which Ford Motor Co. is expected to use; an electrical overhaul for more elaborate displays; and numerous other cosmetic improvements, such as new windows and repairs.

Connors said the enclosed loading docks have reduced energy costs 15 to 20 percent for the past two months, and helped the center recently achieve its certification as a "Green Venue" from the

"We're going to be a green building," he said. "I think that's important to a lot of our clients, and to attract clients in the future."

One thing visitors won't get to experience is Cobo Arena, which is part of the final renovation stage. The former concert venue is being turned into a two-level exhibition space and ballroom.
